MAMMA MIA: THE MOVIE Thursday, January 30, 2025 | 5:30 PM

A DIFFERENT MAN (2024) Friday, January 31, 2025 | 12:00 PM

A 2024 American dark comedy psychological thriller film written and directed by Aaron Schimberg, starring Sebastian Stan, Renate Reinsve, and Adam Pearson. Aspiring actor Edward undergoes a radical medical procedure to drastically transform his appearance. But his new dream face quickly turns into a nightmare, as he loses out on the role he was born to play and becomes obsessed with reclaiming what was lost.

LIVING IN TWO WORLDS Friday, January 31, 2025 | 3:00 PM

Movie based on nonfiction novel "Ro no Ryoshin kara Umareta Boku ga Kikoeru Sekai to Kikoenai Sekai wo Ikikishite Kangaeta 30 no Koto" by Dai Igarashi (published February 10, 2021 by Gentosha). Dai was born to deaf parents and was raised with deep love in rural Japan. However, as he grows older, he becomes troubled by his differences from others and begins to blame his deaf mother for his daily frustrations. When he turns 20, Dai leaves home for Tokyo as if to escape. Life in Tokyo is lonely at first, but when Dai starts working as a magazine reporter, he finds fulfilment in meeting a diverse group of people. Time eventually passes, and Dai returns home for the first time in eight years. In spending a peaceful time with his deaf mother after a long time, a memory that has been sealed away unexpectedly comes back to Dai.

WILD GOAT SURF Friday, January 31, 2025 | 7:00 PM

A 2023 Canadian coming-of-age drama film, directed by Caitlyn Sponheimer. The film stars Shayelin Martin as Rell "Goat" Anderson, a young girl living in a trailer park in Penticton, British Columbia, who aspires to become a surfer like her recently deceased father despite living hundreds of miles from the ocean. The film entered production in August 2022 in and around Penticton and later the film premiered at the 2023 Vancouver International Film Festival.

I DON'T KNOW WHO YOU ARE Saturday, February 1, 2025 | 12:00 PM

A 2023 Canadian drama film, written, directed, and edited by M. H. Murray. Murray's full-length directorial debut, the film stars Mark Clennon as Benjamin, a gay working-class musician who is urgently trying to find \$1,000 to pay for post-exposure prophylaxis to protect himself from HIV after he is sexually assaulted by a stranger. The film premiered in the Discovery program at the 2023 Toronto International Film Festival, before being picked up for theatrical distribution in 2024.

5-DAY FILM CHALLENGE Saturday, February 1, 2025 | 3:00 PM

OSIF has partnered with the Snakebite Film Festival to bring you an exciting film contest with \$3000 total cash prizes to be awarded!

Between January 9th-14th 2025, you will have 5 days to write, shoot and edit a short film. Much like a traditional 48-hour film festival, your team will be given a line of dialogue, a prop, a choice of genre/theme, and a character to come up with a unique and creative story to produce within 5 days. This extra time should allow enough time to properly plan and shoot your project and add an extra polish in the edit.

The top projects will play on the big screen, in front of a live audience, at the Snakebite Film Festival in Penticton on Saturday, February 1st, where one team's film will be announced as the Grand prize winner! The audience will also vote on the winner of the People's Choice Award, awarding an additional cash prize to the recipient!

SUGARCANE Saturday, February 1, 2025 | 7:00 PM

Canadians have been grappling with the true extent of the horrors of the Residential School system since the discovery of more than 200 potential unmarked graves at the former Kamloops Indian Residential School in May 2021, a reckoning that is still in its early stages. Sugarcane is an important contribution to this story, focusing on another BC Residential School, at St. Joseph's Mission — near the Sugarcane reserve — in Williams Lake. For those who continue to deny or to downplay the impact of a colonial system explicitly designed to eradicate Indigenous culture, this should be mandatory viewing.

With sensitivity and compassion, the film introduces us to those doing the hard labour of researching the past, to traumatized survivors who attended the school as children, and to the children of these children, carrying emotional scars they have inherited but cannot fully comprehend. Among these, co-director Julian Brave Noisecat, who journeys with his father Ed back to Williams Lake in the hope of forging a personal reconciliation across the generational divide.

SHEPHERDS Sunday, February 2, 2025 | 12:00 PM

Many might hope to be as lucky in life as Québécois writer Mathyas Lefebure, whose personal crisis of youngadult life spawned a move from Canada to France in order for him to pursue a brand-new vocation as a shepherd. This story of a Canadian run amok in France's Provence region was written by Lefebure himself in his 2006 roman à clef about these experiences, D'ou viens-tu, berger? (lit. "Where Are You From, Shepherd?"). Now, Canadian filmmaker Sophie Deraspe brings Lefebure's tale to the big screen with Shepherds, after a stint in television and her previous film Antigone (which secured the Best Canadian Feature Award at the 2019 Toronto International Film Festival). The Deraspe- and Lefebure-co-written Shepherds has just premiered as a TIFF Special Presentation at this year's Toronto Film Festival.


HIT MAN Sunday, February 2, 2025 | 4:00 PM


Hit Man is a 2023 American black comedy crime film produced and directed by Richard Linklater, who cowrote the screenplay with Glen Powell. The film stars Powell, Adria Arjona, Austin Amelio, Retta, and Sanjay Rao. It follows an undercover New Orleans police contractor who poses as a reliable hitman as he tries to save a woman in need. The basic premise was based on the true story of a college professor who worked for the Houston police in the late 1980s and 1990s as a fake hitman, as described in a 2001 magazine article by Skip Hollandsworth.
